reading some T.S. Eliot to cheer me down but it just felt so...empty."


"It really makes you wonder what happened to the old ways. I'm concerned that some students may not contemplate suicide after reading it. Truly dangerous stuff"




The student later dropped out of Melbourne High, going on to get a 98.5 ATAR at Nossal and becoming a disappointment to his family.




### SENIOR BUILDING FLOOR PLANS




